A theoretical framework for migrant workers' collectivism is developed and utilised in sector based comparative case studies in Germany, Denmark and the UK. The project further investigates how the political and economic context along with institutions and actors like unions can enhance or hinder the inclusion of migrant workers in collective labour market solutions and how migrant characteristics (e.g. type and length of stay, nationality, gender etc.) contribute to explain migrant workers' orientation towards collectivism. It seeks to contribute to overcoming the knowledge gap on migrant collectivism through comparative case studies in Denmark, Germany and the UK that can illuminate the main factors explaining how collectivism emerges.
